What goes on?



Our Sunday morning service includes a mix of hymns and songs, preaching, prayer, and worship. Some Sundays we have musicians and singers, and other Sundays we sing to backing CDs.



Currently our services are being led by church members and external speakers. We meet at 10am and the service is followed by refreshments and a time of fellowship. Currently we celebrate communion once a month and the children's group meets twice a month during the second half of the service.

On Tuesday evenings an online home group meets together from 7:30 - 9:00pm. We are keen to explore more activities again.

Each year we organise a group from the Church with friends and family, to attend Spring Harvest at Skegness or Minehead. We have attended Spring Harvest as a church since it first started in 1979.





At other times of the year we have bring and share lunches, craft days, social evenings, breakfasts and rambles and of course special services for Easter, Harvest and Christmas including a nativity, carols by candlelight, midnight communion and a Christmas morning service.

We have a church council consisting of the minister (vacant), treasurer, secretary (vacant) and five deacons, who are responsible for overseeing the church. The treasurer and secretary are elected annually and deacons are elected for three years and can serve two concurrent terms.

Our Buildings




Highams Park Baptist Church was founded in 1913. We have a spacious sanctuary that seats c.100 people. Our modern facilities include a well-equipped kitchen and kitchenette, toilets, a vestry, a prayer room

/office, two lounges, a courtyard garden and two large halls that are used by some 300 people from the community each week.



The groups that use our buildings include keep fit groups, a pre-school, and the 17th Pals' Battalion Band (which sprang from our former Boys Brigade Company), a dance academy, a film club and a drama group.



The church owns a manse located approximately ½ mile from the church (15 minute walk). It is a spacious, attractively decorated, 1930s, semidetached house which has four bedrooms, a new kitchen and bathroom, double glazing, gas central heating, off-street parking and a good sized manageable garden.

Local Area





Highams Park is a lovely place to live and work. It has lots of green space and is close to Epping Forest and High Beech. The area is mainly residential with a mixture of Victorian and terraced housing alongside newer flats, both private and council owned, housing approximately 11,000 culturally diverse people.

We have a small central shopping area which includes a Tesco store, independent small shops and restaurants, a library, a post office and medical centre, a large secondary school (Highams Park School) and two primary schools. Selwyn Primary School is immediately opposite our church building.



There is a large park and lake about 15 minutes walk from the church called "The Highams Park" from which the area gets its name. There is also a small wood, allotments and a variety of sports and fitness options.



Situated in the north of the London Borough of Waltham Forest, nestled between Epping Forest, Chingford and Woodford Green it has its own railway station with Walthamstow Central (on the Victoria Line) two stops away and Liverpool Street a 23 minute ride.

he city is a 30 minute commute away, with all the entertainment, shopping and culture offered there. Three bus routes come through Highams Park giving access throughout Waltham Forest and beyond, or venture away from London with Stanstead Airport a 35 minute drive away and the coast a 55 minute drive.

Whether you like walking, swimming, fishing, watching football (Leyton Orient), drinking coffee or a tipple at your local pub, getting a bargain at Walthamstow market or our own monthly farmers market there is plenty to see and do locally. The Highams Park Society, Highams Park Planning Group, Highams Park Forum (business group) and The Friends of the Highams Park are all quite active organising local events which adds a vibrancy to the area.

We like to keep in regular touch with our members, wider church family, friends and the local community. We produce a weekly news bulletin, a bi-monthly magazine and have a church website. The magazine is sent to friends and past members of the church, and those who are unable to attend for health or other reasons.

Our Sunday services are recorded and are made available on the website. We have cluster groups to keep in touch with our church family and also send prayer requests by text and e.mail to people in the church as and when need arises.

We are currently talking with other ministers in Highams Park to reestablish Churches Together. One church runs a food bank to which we contribute and some members help with Christian Kitchen. Some of our members are also involved in Care Highams Park, which is led by Winchester Road Methodist Church.

We are members of London Baptists and the Baptist Union of Great Britain. We also support the work of BMS World Mission and Baptist Home Mission.
